Allen, Filliam E. Harrison, Benjamin Filrod and Eugene B. Sibilski to be Corporals. Fvt's Albert K. Barker, Rudy J. Cavanaugh, Harold L. Kelly and Irwin F. Mirkle to be Frivates First Class. (S.O. No. 56, Hg, 368th Ftr Op, 1 June 1945). The following pilots received promotions today: 1st It Frisbie to be Captain and Englits Buck, Chancellor, Leputy, Johnston, Knooihuizen, Laughbaugh, Shepard and woodworth to be 1st Lieutenants. I looked back and saw that Propic blue flight was bexed in by about 15 Ma. we turned around and headed back to help them. As we did this, an To 190 dove down in front of us. I gave him a 50 degree deflection shot which hit him squarely in the cookpit. He broke left in a shellow dive. I closed to 100 yards and fired again. The canopy flaw off the 3/A and the pilot bailed out. se started a climbing turn to the left to get back into the fight. Is we did so, on Me 109 came across in front of me. I fired a burst and observed strikes on the wings and fuselage of the MA. He broke for the deek and I followed. I closed to about 150 yards and fired a long burst. The fo pulled up, and as he did so, the simplene exploded. As we started another climbing turn, I observed about 12 s/A coming in on us. se broke into them and were doing all right until suddenly my coexpit blew up. 1 slid the empoy back and bailed out, bitting the tail as I went out. I was knocked unconcious, and came to in a vineyard. I slaim one Fa 190 destroyed and one 33 109 dectroyed. J. Assumition expended . Unknown . Combet film is not avmilable.

Being in a disadvantageous position on the desk, we immediately began to climb and to turn toward blue flight which was engaged in combat. Before we reached it, a single Pa 190 flew across in front of us. I had no mater injection so I climbed up about 500 feet to protect bejor Leary from behind. Major leary fired a deflection burst at the Ma, then closed and fired again. I saw the pilot jettison his encopy and bail out. se started to climb again and as we did so, we encountered a single RE 109. hajor leary attacked the m/m closing in behind it. He fired a burst, and I saw the m/m explode and crash in flames. To started to climb again and were attacked by about 12 %/. ajor leary's plane caught fire and he bailed out. I was hit in the gun bey and the door was blown off. by plane was losing power and was very hard to control. I was hit again and my controls were stat away. I bailed out and landed in some trees. I, lat "t Milton S. Bender, AND 0-763468, was leading Tropic Yellow flight on an armed recommaissance and dive bombing mission on 14 January 1948. Yellow flight was serving as cover for Red flight while it was down strafing at Neustadt, Germany. Yellow flight was at about 10,000° altitude. Elue flight sighted the enemy fighters and called them in first. Over forty ME 109's and FE 190's attacked from our right and out of the sun. I got on the tail of one of the 109's almost immediately and fired about a five second burst. The E/A burst into flames, dove down and crashed.

Another ME 109 came across in front of me. I turned left and fired with about 30 degrees deflection. I fired about three five second bursts, and finally saw his plane burst into flame. I turned away from him then and flow straight and level for a few seconds trying to locate the rest of the squadron.


My plane was hit from behind by an enemy aircraft which I did not see, and I was thrown into a spin. I stopped the spin and tried to pull cut of the dive, but the plane would not respond. I bailed out and was taken prisoner about four hours later.

I claim two ME 109's destroyed.

Our Squadron broke up into flights after being relieved of our original job of patroling the beachhead. We headed northeast from St. 10 and finally turned back. Upon doing so we encounted a dozen 190's and 109's circling. We proceeded to break this flight up and took out after a 109 that was along, this plane headed towards Germany with us in close pursuit. This is the plane that I believe I shot down. After pulling up and watching this plane employe I joined Lt. Polta's wing and we started back along having lost the other two of the flight when we encountered the Jerries. Upon turning homeward the two of us turned into four more planes. We started turning with them. At three quarter sround Lt. Polta told me to break right an a Jerry 190 was coming up from the deck at about 2'0'clock. I broke down into him. After going past him I was just going to pull back up into the fight when flak hit my engine or else it exploded. My mercury read zero and as my prop was starting to stop I decided to leave the ship. I relied it over and come out perfectly O.F., I pulled the rip cord and hit a tree before the first owing. The fight was started at about 1200 feet and I bailed out at or less than 500 feet.
