



Letter from Col. Arno B. Furth

Last February, Tim received this email and the MACR report, which has been added to our archives. *Sirs*,

I live in Ahrbrück the village where 2nd Lt. Russell J. Grosjean, MACR# 10270, crashed into the mountain "Katzberg" on 07 Nov 1944 with his P-47D 42-28844.

An eyewitness told me the plane was attacking the Luftwaffe training installation from the Ahr river valley in the West. The Plane was very low when it closed in on the target (barracks and HQ of the training facility, find a picture attached below).

It crashed into the Northern slope of the Katzberg about 150 meters above the buildings. When hitting the trees it chopped of their tips creating a path approximately 100 meters long before touching ground. The a/c fragmented into pieces and the pilot was killed.

As by Luftwaffe regulations the corps was buried in the closest civilian Cemetery.

In this case the village Kesseling in the Eifel mountains.

I hold a report of this incident -most of it in German- if you are interested let me know.
