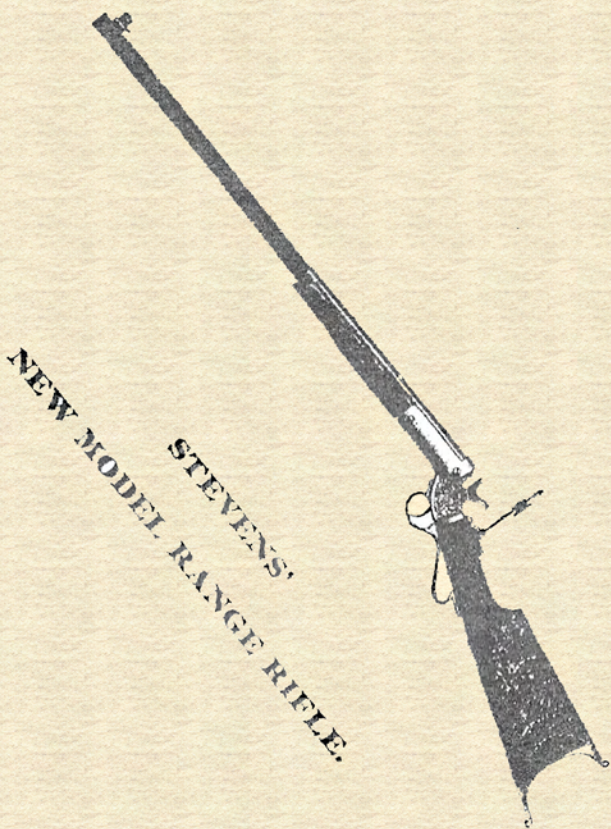

TERMS :

OUR TERMS ARE CASH WITH ORDER OR C. O. D.

C. O. D. orders from parties not known to us must be accompanied by twenty-five per cent. of amount of goods ordered, which sum will be deducted from the amount to be collected; the Express Company's charges for returning the amount collected will be at the expense of the purchaser.

We deliver no goods: our responsibility rests with receipts of Transportation Company.

Caps, Primers, Cartridges, Primed Shells, etc., cannot be sent by mail. Re-loading Tools, Sights, Parts of Arms, etc., not exceeding four pounds in weight, can be sent by mail to all parts of the United States at an expense of one cent per ounce.

Such packages can be registered at an extra expense of ten cents, and safe delivery guaranteed.

Our Arms are sold by all Gun and Hardware Dealers throughout the United States and Canada.

Ship all goods by the American Express Co. or in its care, and thus save both time, and exorbitant express rates, as that is the only express which reaches Chicopee Falls direct.

When sending goods for repairs, unscrew the barrel from frame and wrap each piece up separately in several sheets of strong paper, then make one package of the whole, and again see that they are well protected with extra sheets of paper; this will not only prevent the Arms from being damaged, but will reduce the express charges materially.

All guns, gun parts, samples, etc., sent us should be plainly marked with name and address of party sending, and all express charges should be prepaid.

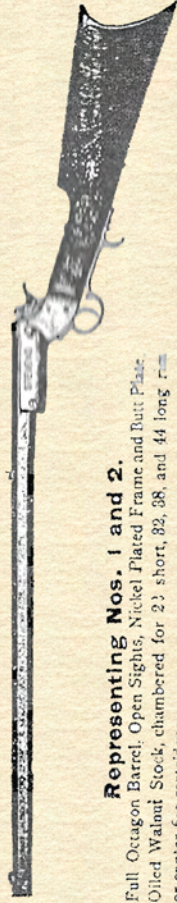

Those who have used our arms, take pleasure in recommending them to their friends, knowing full well that *we never allow an imperfect article to leave our factory.* Our rifling and boring is done by the finest of machinery and particular attention is given to have it perfectly systematic, so that one gun will shoot just as well as another. We claim the greatest possible accuracy, which is based upon the testimonials of sportsmen, rifle galleries, and experts with rifle or shot-gun. The *simplicity* of our arms is an important feature. The *compactness* and *portability* of them should receive special notice, as the stock can be detached from the barrel in less time than it takes to tell it, thus enabling the owner to put them in an ordinary trunk, when travelling, and also allows of having as many barrels of all the different calibres of rifle and shot barrels as may be desired, *only one stock and frame* being required for them all.

When ordering goods please give the number of rifle, and style of cartridge wanted, whether rim or central fire, as all our rifles are chambered for rim fire cartridge unless otherwise ordered.

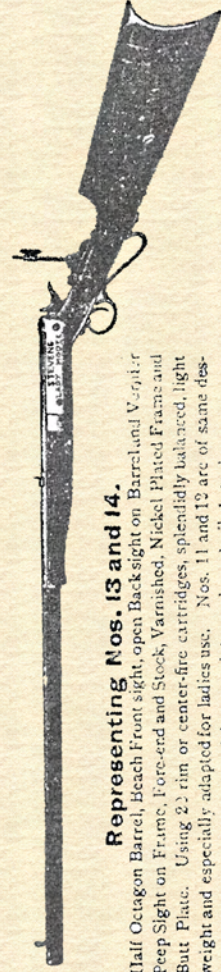

They differ materially from regular 22 long R. F. cartridges, both as to quantity of powder and weight of bullet.

Guns taking this cartridge, will without cleaning, shoot the hundredth shot as accurately as the first.

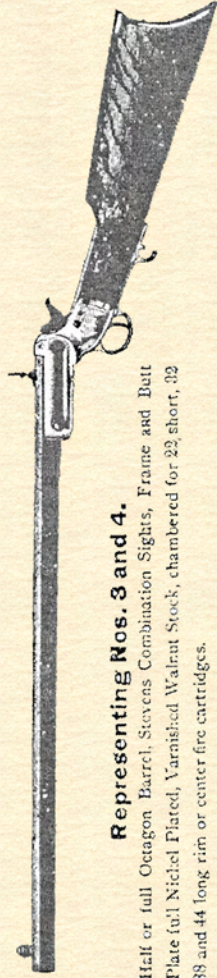

As constructed, it expels the exploded primer, reseats the new one, forces the bullet to place, crimps the shell upon it, leaving the cartridge ready for use. To this a bullet mould is attached, and being nicely finished and nickel-plated, makes it the most useful, as well as the neatest, little implement ever made.

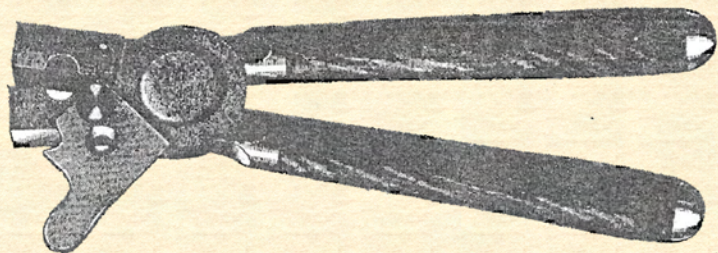

BULLET MOULD.



To cast a good bullet, the mould should be hot, and hot iron is not very pleasant for the hand. Having experienced this ourselves, we have sought to overcome this universal fault, by having handles of wood, which are secured by the shank of the mould passing through, and fastened. The joint of our mould has a large pin, and the surface is broad, which guarantees the mould being kept in place. The handles bear upon the center, not one over the other, as in most cases. Price \$1.10.

Directions for Loading Rifle Cartridges.

In loading shells for target shooting, be sure that the charges are always the same. Fill the shell with powder within 1-16 inch of the top, settling it well by tapping with some light article, or which is better, pour slowly through a loading tube. Put the bullet into the shell with the ball-seater, adjusting it so that it just goes home and does not crush the powder. In loading for hunting, use 8 or 10 grains less powder, place a wad on it, and a lubricating disc over the wad. When grooved bullets are used, dip them in a melted lubricant, base end first, until the grooves are filled; place in the shell and dip quickly in the lubricant, which should be quite hot. Make the lubricant of clear tallow, four parts; beeswax, one part. Do not use any of the quick grades of gunpowder; F. G. has been found the best for use in rifles.

In casting bullets, be careful to keep the mould hot; in this way, a very perfect ball can be produced. But as much depends on the projectile, more especially in target shooting, it is preferable to purchase bullets ready-made, as they are accurately swaged to the correct size.

Directions for Loading Shot Cartridges.

Parties using our guns are recommended to use two wads over the powder, pink edge are best, but black will answer, and a thin wad over shot—ram down the wads over powder very hard, but just put the wad on shot squarely and lightly down. Those who have the most experience use a *small charge* of fine shot and a heavy charge of powder. A small charge of No. 8 with a heavy charge of powder, will kill as far as shot two sizes larger with a light charge of powder. For breech loaders of 12 gauge we think the best charge is 1 oz. of shot and 3 to 4 drams of Hazard's F. G. powder, for 10 bore use 1 1/4 oz. shot and 3 to 6 drams of powder.

As a guide for charges of powder and shot to be used with different gauge and weight Guns, we submit the following as a basis, although "the distribution" can be increased either by decreasing the quantity of powder used or increasing the quantity of shot. And to produce better "penetration," increase the quantity of powder used or decrease the amount of shot. The *exact* amount of ammunition required to be used with each Gun, to give satisfactory results to parties owning the Gun, can only be ascertained by repeated trials at a target.

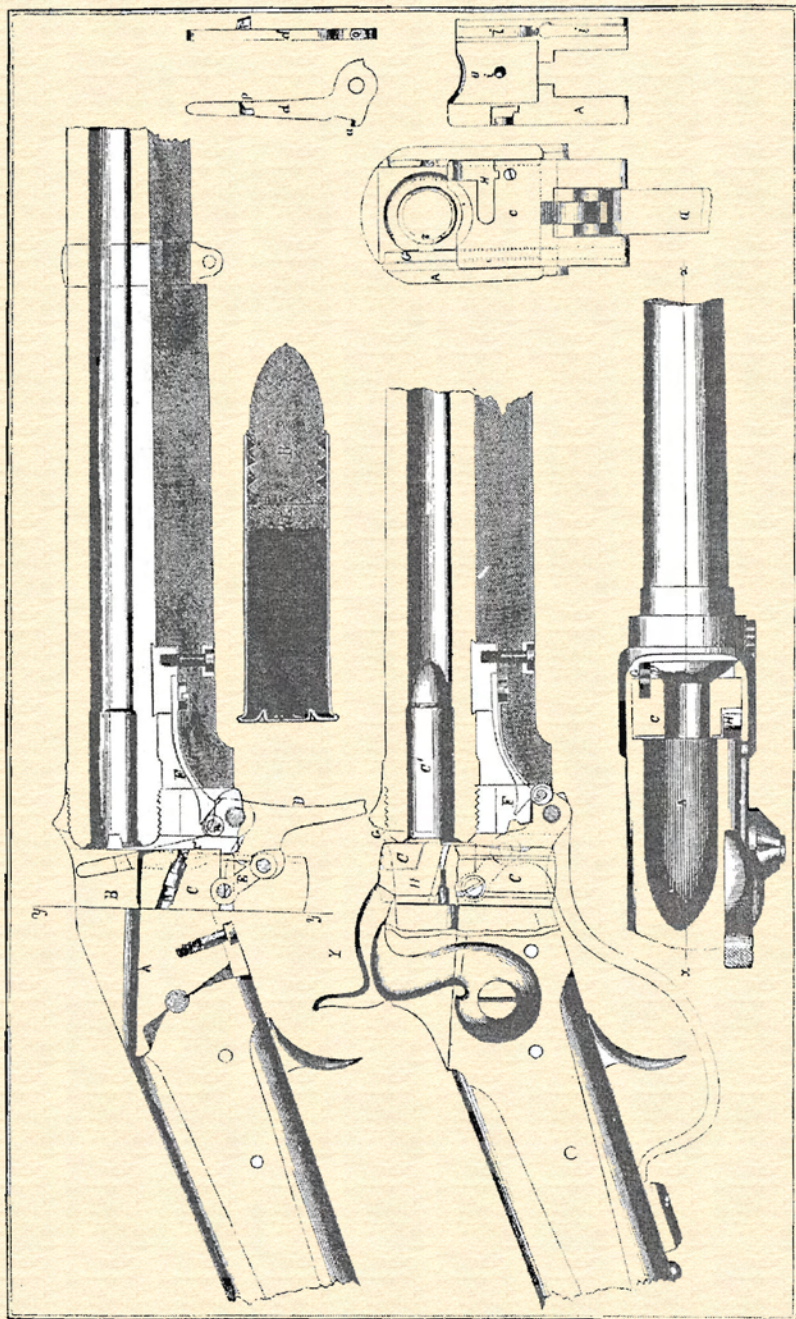
